

DARK FABRIC TRANSFER PAPER INSTRUCTION

Dark fabric transfer paper is designed for the dark color cotton fabrics (best transfer effect for fabric with 60% cotton and more). Follow the steps below to create your own personalized, wearable art.

Settings

Printer setting: Paper type: Plain paper

Quality: High

Cutter setting: Cicut maker: glitter vinyl

Silhouette: Blade: 3 Force: 2 Speed: 6 Passes 2

NOTE: Do not use sublimation ink

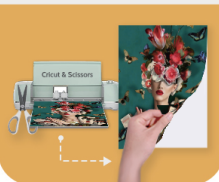
How to Use

1 Print



Print your design on the blank side of transfer paper. Don't mirror the image.

2 Cut & Peel



Use a cutting machine or a craft knife to trim out image to desired shape. Peel off your design.

3 Remove creases



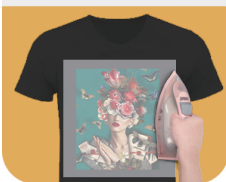
Place the garment on a hard, heat resistant surface. Iron the garment to remove creases.

4 Position the design



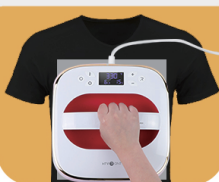
Position your design FACING UP on the garment. Cover completely with a parchment paper provided.

5 Transfer by home iron



If you use an iron, preheat iron to cotton setting. DO NOT USE STEAM. Preheat for 3 minutes, then start the transfer. Evenly apply pressure on each corner for 2-3 minutes.

5 Transfer by heat press



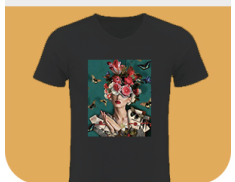
If you use a heat press, set temperature at 320-338°F (160-170°C). Set at medium to high pressure for best results. Press for 10-15 seconds.

6 Remove parchment paper



Wait 5 seconds after transfer, then peel off parchment paper.

Success!



Finish the transfer.

Washing Instructions

1. Don't pull the fabric hard after transfer. Don't wear or wash within 48 hours.
2. When washing, turn inside out, please use cold water.
3. Don't use bleach or alkaline detergent when washing. Don't rub designs with your hands.
4. Don't use a dryer. High temperature will dissolve the design, please air dry in a cool place.

Storage Instructions

- Keep material away from direct sunlight. Store in a cool, dry area.
- The remaining must be put back into the package.
